

## WALK 9

This walk is suitable for pedestrians only. Wellies in winter, strong shoes in summer.

Time: approx 1 hour.

Distance: approx 2 miles.

Starting point is Gall End **A**.

Walk up the slope in a north-easterly direction to **FP19** running between two high fences to the north of Yew Tree Cottage and follow the line of the fence. At the end of the fence, the right-of-way goes in a north, north-easterly direction across the field to the corner **B** of a small wood called Brickyard Plantation. Follow the path through the wood and at its northern side the footpath continues north, north-easterly in a straight line across a second field skirting the edge of the Aubrey Buxton Nature Reserve to **BR25** at Keeper's Cottage.

Turn right here and skirt the southern boundary of Alsa Wood, left on **FP44** past Alsa Wood Cottage and over the M11 via the footbridge. You are now in Eisenham parish.

Continue through the wood on **FP32** in an easterly direction and at the eastern boundary of the wood turn right onto **FP29**. Following the edge of the wood, go straight onto the Eisenham Road. Turn right here and follow the road back towards the village, turning right beside "Hawthorns" **C** onto **FP18** and back to Gall End.

This walk can be slightly shortened by taking **FP41** to Gall End at **D** marked on the map halfway along the Eisenham Road.
